**NON-PUBLICATION DIRECTION
PURSUANT TO SECTION 6D(3)**


Pursuant to s 6D(3) of the *Royal Commissions Act 1902* (Cth), I direct that so much of the contents of the statement of evidence of Mr Alastair Welsh in response to Rubric 3-11, as discloses:

- (a) contact and identifying information of customers of Westpac Banking Corporation and its associated entities (within the meaning of that term as defined in s 50AAA of the *Corporations Act 2001* (Cth)) (collectively, **Westpac**), except for Marion Messih's name and the name of the business Marjo (VIC) Pty Ltd and the Marjo Family Trust, and the suburbs in which the two properties previously owned by Ms Messih are located;
- (b) contact and identifying information of customers of any third parties;
- (c) direct contact information of employees of Westpac and employees of any third parties;
- (d) the information identified as commercially sensitive in Westpac's application for non-publication directions dated 17 May 2018, except for:
 - i. the information identified at Items 2 to 12 of that application;
 - ii. the information identified at Item 18 of that application; and
- (e) the information identified as commercially sensitive in Item 1 of Westpac's application for non-publication directions dated 17 May 2018, except for the information in relation to page .8861 of WBC.400.046.8857 (other than the text immediately following the second dot point in the first row under the heading "Requirement" and the last two bullet points in the first row under the heading "Evidence of requirement"); and
- (f) identifying information of any individuals against whom allegations of misconduct have been made, or, in respect of whom, in the context of the particular document, it is suggested have been involved in misconduct,



not be published except to the Commission, its staff and counsel and solicitors assisting the Commission, and to Westpac and its counsel and solicitors.
